In Australia - Model 35PA-2 Airsnip Adapted For Sheep

These are pictures of a Jarvis Model 35PA-2 Airsnip adapted for sheep processing. Special jaws were built to hold down and steady sheep legs while operators are making cuts. Because the Model 35PA-2 is air assisted, it is safer than an air operated tool. The jaws can be stopped at any position by the operator.
