Jarvis Continues to Serve South Africa's Meat Processing Industry









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Two New Tools - Teflon Coated Bung Cavity Cleaner and EBS-1H Horn Removal Saw

Jarvis is introducing two new tools - a new teflon coated bung cleaner and an economical horn removal saw. Jarvis' all stainless constructed Bung Cavity Cleaner uses steam to remove contaminants from the bung area. It is lightweight (handpiece weighs less than Bung Cavity C

4 pounds or 1.8 kg) for easier handling and operator comfort, and the teflon coating makes it easier to clean. An optional tool cleaning sanitizer is also available.
