#### **New Toyoda Machines Improve Jarvis' Production Capabilities**


Corporation recently pur-

chased two, state-of-the -art Toyoda FA 450 machining controllers with a 60 pallet R.G.V. (rail guided vehicle) system, for the Middletown facility. The PC controlled FA450 can machine up to 16 different parts from a 60 piece initial load. Raw material pieces are placed on 60 individual pallets adjacent to the machine. A single operator designates the part and software program required per piece. After the part is finished, it's automatically returned to a designated pallet.

Overview of A 450 system

Besides machining, the FA450 also allows operators to manage/schedule all machining procedures, and instantly monitor all performed work. At the same time, an operator can monitor the FA 450's operation and production status - in real time. Any problems are instantly detected and corrected. All information is data logged for future reference and analysis. For Jarvis, the end result is producing a better, precisely machined, quality product, at a lower production cost; helping us beat the competition.
