

approximately 4 million) of temperate climate and ample rainfall supports a herd of 49 million sheep (12 sheep for every


person), 10 million cattle, 1.8 million deer (New Zealand has the world's largest deer farming industry - 65% of the world's farmed deer population), and 160,000 goats.

Unlike other places, which feed their sheep a grain and

supplement diet, New Zealand sheep only graze on wideopen natural pastoral lands. Meat is the country's second largest food

export, and is shipped world-wide to over 70 countries, with the United Kingdom, United States and Germany being the three largest export customers.



Other interesting facts: New Zealand meat producers receive the lowest amount of government assistance than any other country in the developed world. Also, several of the country's largest meat processing companies (PPCS, LENNO


