Besides attending the expo, Harry Chamberlain, accompanied by Jarvis China and Lenno representatives, toured local processing plants in the greater Beijing area.



Recently, Edgar Moore, owner of Equipos Multiples Moore, C.A, Jarvis' distributor in Venezuela, visited the Middletown facility. Accompanying Mr. Moore was his daughter Jean, the company's Vice President responsible for organization and methods. Besides discussing current Venezuelan business conditions and long-term prospects with Mr. Volpe, Edgar and Jean also toured the production area and saw some of the latest computerized tooling and production technologies that have greatly streamlined Jarvis' manufacturing processes.

Located in Charallave, a city 30 miles (48 km) south of Caracas, Equipos Multiples Moore was originally founded in 1976 as an importer of air conditioning equipment. Mr. Moore's association with Jarvis began in 1995 with an initial order for 30 JCIIIA Dehiders. Today, he regularly imports band and brisket saws, beef dehorners and hock cutters for Venezuela's major meat processing plants. Poultry tools, for local poultry processors, are also imported.
